Stanford Fund Scholarships: Meeting Immediate Needs

Annual gifts play an important role in filling the gap between financial aid endowment and the total need of today’s students. The impact of Stanford Fund gifts on the bottom line is immediate: A gift of \$25,000 is roughly equivalent to the annual payout on a \$500,000 endowed fund.

Each year, approximately 1,000 students receive scholarship support from The Stanford Fund. In some cases, The Stanford Fund meets a student’s entire need; in others, Stanford Fund dollars are added to endowed scholarship funding to complete a student’s financial aid package.

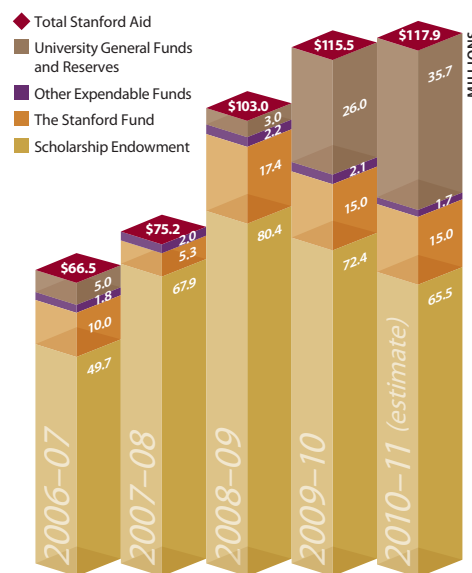
Donors who give \$25,000 or more per year to The Stanford Fund have a unique opportunity to help. Their leadership gifts will establish Stanford Fund Scholarships that help underwrite financial aid for individual student recipients. 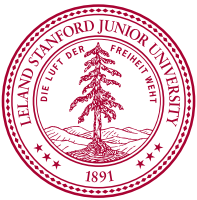
Stanford undergraduates are no longer required to take out loans, but they are still expected to help finance their education. The “student responsibility” comes from earnings and savings, or from outside scholarships, if available. With \$2,200 from a summer job, a student can earn the remaining \$2,800 by working eight to ten hours a week during the academic year.

Lower levels apply for young alumni:
